

IDOT PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENT DETERMINATION

Re: FAI 24 (Bridge repair, Patching and resurfacing from the Massac County line to US 45
{January 21, 2022 letting}

In accordance with the Project Labor Agreement Act (30 ILCS 571), it is recommended that a project labor agreement (PLA) be utilized for the above-captioned Project. This recommendation is based on the considerations indicated below.

1) The Project is being awarded and administered by IDOT (i.e., not by another governmental agency).

2) The Project is being constructed using state or local funds only (i.e., no federal funds).

3) The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances.

4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time.

5) There is a firm construction completion date established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption.

6) The time required to complete the Project is expected to extend beyond the expiration date of one or more existing collective bargaining agreements covering trades likely to be involved in the Project, thereby increasing the likelihood of work stoppage(s) or other labor disruption(s) during construction of the Project.

7) In the absence of a PLA, there is an increased likelihood of jurisdictional disputes among unions or of conflict between unionized and non-unionized workers on the Project that could have a potentially material adverse effect on the time, cost, or quality of work performed on the Project.

8) This project presents specific safety concerns to the traveling public and a PLA, will ensure labor force continuity and stability, decreasing the length of the safety concern.

9) Use of a PLA is expected to result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency, or improved safety performance on the Project.

10) Use of a PLA on the Project is not expected to have a material adverse effect on the competitive bidding process.

11) Use of a PLA on the Project is not expected to have a material adverse effect on the ability of the Department to achieve other Departmental goals (e.g., utilization of disadvantaged businesses, utilization of Illinois domiciled businesses, development of competitive vendor alternatives over time, etc.).


12) There are other material considerations favoring or disfavoring use of a PLA on this Project as follows:

Based upon the identified considerations, we recommend that you approve use of a PLA on this Project. Upon your approval, the Department shall undertake to negotiate in good faith a PLA with the relevant labor organization(s), and shall include in all necessary bid specifications and other documents information regarding the actual or form of PLA that is to binding upon all contractors and their employees.

ATTACHMENT A:

This is an Interstate SMART Project for I-24 in Johnson Co. The EB and WB Lanes as well as all Ramps of the US 45 and Vienna interchanges will be milled and resurfaced. Both Pavement and Shoulders will receive 1½" Milling replaced with 1½" HMA Surface. Additionally, the project involves Class A Patching, PCC Shoulders at Bridges, guardrail work and Pavement Marking. Bridge repairs including elimination of expansion joints by converting to integral or semi-integral abutments, a new Latex Concrete Overlays, new bridge approach slabs and new connector pavements on 12 Bridges. Program amount is \$18,700,000

#3: An adjacent project will be on a letting in FY 2023. This project must be completed by the completion date in order to avoid conflicts with adjacent contract.



Due to the high traffic volumes these temporary conditions, while necessary during construction, pose a safety hazard to the traveling public. This hazard can be mitigated by minimizing the time that these temporary conditions are in place.


