This recommendation is based on the considerations indicated below. 1) The Project is being awarded and administered by IDOT (i.e., not by another governmental agency). 2) The Project is being constructed using state or local funds only (i.e., no federal funds). 3) The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances. (See Attachment A) 4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time. 5) There is a firm construction completion date established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption. Item 3: The estimated project cost is \$4,300,000.

<u>Item 5</u>. Construction will begin on April 1, 2014 with a Prospective completion date of November 15, 2014; see the Special Provisions for the final completion date.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the first stage of the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

<u>Item 8</u> The project location is a very busy intersection. The north leg of US Route 12/20/45 (LaGrange Road) carries approximately 39,000 average daily traffic(ADT) and the south leg carries approximately 37,000 (ADT); the west leg of Joliet Road carries

approximately 22,000 (ADT), and the east leg of Joliet Road carries approximately 23,000 (ADT) The intersection is located within the City of Countryside and the Village of Hodgkins municipalities in Cook County. As with any project under construction, some motorists will choose to find an alternate route to avoid driving in a construction zone. Due to the limited network of north-south and east-west routes; major delay are anticipated since there are no easily accessible, uncongested alternate routes.

<u>Item 12</u>. The project extends through one construction season. The trades that are expected to be used on this project include but are not limited to be the following: Laborers, Carpenters, Operators, Teamsters, Cement Masons, Electricians and Ironworkers. Any work stoppage due to expiring union contracts will have major impacts to the construction schedule and the timely completion of the project.
