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#### **Attachment A**

Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract **68E42**, **Tazewell** County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

### **Project Description**

This project is located on Interstate 155 (I-155) over Indian Creek near Hopedale, Illinois in Tazewell County. This project consists of bridge replacements of Structure Nos. 090-0093 and 090-0094 carrying Interstate 155 (I-155) over Indian Creek in Tazewell County. Crossovers will be utilized to maintain traffic during construction. Also included are minor drainage improvements, pavement tapers, and other related collateral work.

**Item 3:** The estimated project cost is \$8.8 million. The challenging logistics for this project include staged construction utilizing crossovers to maintain traffic during construction. The northbound structure shall be completed by November 3, 2023 (during the first construction season) and the southbound structure shall be completed by October 24, 2024 (during the second construction season). No Temporary Concrete Barrier wall will be permitted on traveled lanes during winter shutdown (November 3, 2023 – April 1, 2024).

**Item 5:** The project has a completion date of October 4, 2024 plus 20 working days to complete permanent pavement markings, raised reflective, final topsoil, and seeding, clean up, and punchlist items. The completion date is based on an expedited work schedule.

Item 6: The time required to complete the project extends beyond the expiration of one or more existing collective bargaining agreements covering trades likely to be involved in the project. The trades that will be used on this project include but are not limited to those listed below. Trade contracts expiring prior to the anticipated construction completion date are indicated with bold font.
