Justification for use of project Labor Agreement on Contract # 68A40, McDonough County

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project in consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 2: This project is federally funded.

Item 3: Estimated project cost is \$5,950,000

Item 8:

Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in a winter shutdown condition where existing traffic cannot be moved to the original four-lane pavement. This may result in a decrease in safety due to use of temporary run-around.

Item 12:

In addition, user delay costs would be incurred from traffic operating at reduced speeds if construction was delayed past the deadline. Speed limit reduced during construction from 55 mph to 45 mph for the entire length of the project. The reduction in speed causes 0.003 hours of time lost per vehicle. Using a cost of \$15.65 per hour of user delay for passenger vehicles and \$26.05 per hour of user delay for trucks, the following delay costs are calculated:

Trucks – 365 trucks/day * 0.003 hours/vehicle *\$26.05/hour of delay = \$57/day

Passenger vehicles - 6945 cars/day * 0.003 hours/vehicle *\$15.65/hour of delay = \$326/day

Total user delay cost for work stoppage while construction staging is in place = \$383/day
