Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract 66F93 Livingston County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

Project Description:

The work consists of replacement of the bridge (SN 053-0114) carrying IL 17 over I-55 at Dwight. The project also includes earthwork, shared use path construction, and safety and drainage improvements.

Item 3&4:

Estimated project cost is \$7,200,000 with 110 working days. Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in the delay of deadlines which would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project duration would be addressed through use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement

Item 6:

The contract calls for 110 working days and is anticipated to extend into late 2023 or beyond. The targeted completion timeframe of the contract falls beyond some of the union contract expiration dates:

Item 8:

Work on or adjacent to the Interstate poses increased safety risks if suspended in an incomplete state due to labor disputes. This project will require temporary removal of a section of High Tension Cable Median Barrier while median work is completed.

Item 9:

The use of a PLA on this project will result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency and improved safety performance because it will assist in coordinating the labor forces of six separate trade unions that may be involved in its construction efforts.
