## **Attachment A**

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract 66K66 Bureau County:

The use of a project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory regulatory requirements.

### **Project Description:**

The project involves replacement of of a pair of structure replacements and superstructure replacement for a pair of structures on the interstate. The project also includes related roadway, earthwork, safety and drainage improvements.

### Item 3&4:

Estimated project cost is \$21,200,000 with a project completion date of October 30, 2026 plus 10 working days. Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in the delay of deadlines which would cause safety concerns for the travelling public. Lapsing trade contracts during the project duration would be addressed through use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement

### <u>Item 5&6:</u>

The contract calls for a completion date of October 30, 2026 plus 10 working days. The targeted completion timeframe of the contract falls beyond some of the union contract expiration dates:

#### Item 8:

Work on or adjacent to the Interstate poses increased safety risks if suspended in an incomplete state due to labor disputes. This project will use crossovers and temporary concrete barrier to maintain traffic on one side of the interstate while the work is completed on the other side of the roadway. Project delays due to labor disputes could prolong interstate lane restrictions, creating a safety concern.

#### Item 9:

The use of a PLA on this project will result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency and improved safety performance because it will assist in coordinating the labor forces of seven separate trade unions that may be involved in its construction efforts.
