Attachment A

Justification for use of Project Labor Agreement on Contract No. 72829, Christian & Sangamon Counties.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

- Item 2: The project is both *state* and *federally* funded. This contract is an *Illinois Jobs Now!* capital improvement project.
- Item 3: The estimate cost for this project is \$50,000,000.

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to the labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is a necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 4: The project requires 270 working days. Construction of the project will take place over multiple construction seasons.

There is mainline construction as well as multiple intersecting side roads that will require construction activities to be stage constructed thus impacting the motoring public.

- Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may present safety concerns to the motoring public. Traffic control left in place for an extended period of time, especially over the winter months, may contribute to additional exposure to crashes through the work zone, due to the inherent risk of driver inattention to lane changes, etc. that will be in place during stage construction.
- Item 12: The various trades that may be used on the project include Carpenters, Finishers, Iron Workers, Laborers, Operators and Teamsters.

- Traffic will be maintained with one lane of traffic in both directions. Traffic will remain on the
 existing pavement during varies phases while other times traffic will be shifted to new pavement via
 crossovers to allow for construction activities during the temporary pavement transitions.
- o Traffic will be switched four times during each stage of construction.
- o No lane closures will be allowed on two-lane, two-way roadways without flagger protection.
- Portable changeable message boards will be provided to inform the traveling public
- o "Uneven Lane" signs shall be erected whenever both lanes of traffic and there is a difference of elevation at the centerline.
- Bump signs shall be placed when the Engineer deems necessary.
- Minor road closures will be required for the side road construction.
- o There is over 8000 ADT.
