Attachment A

The use of a Project Labor Agreement (PLA) for Contract 62F95 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item3: This project includes both State and Federal funding and the programmed cost for this project is estimated at \$12,500,000. The scope of work for the Montrose Avenue over I-90 bridge project within the City of Chicago involves the replacement of the existing bridge deck and concrete bridge girders with new steel girders/beams, reconstruction of the abutment backwalls on both sides of the bridge, rehabilitation and repairs of the bridge substructure to include patching and crack sealing of the existing piers and abutments, reconstruction of the existing pier caps, new bridge and underpass lighting, existing traffic signal minor modifications and construction of new bridge approach slabs in addition to pavement markings, ADA ramps at the bridge and the approaches.

Item 5: The completion date is October 30, 3020 plus 5 working days for punch list and clean-up items. The reconstruction of the existing bridge will be completed under a road closure with vehicular traffic detour around the site on the State's highway system. Access to the Montrose Avenue Blue Line CTA station will be maintained for the duration of the project. Completing the project within one construction season is critical as any delay would impact motoring traffic and users of the CTA station. There are a limited number of available routes crossing Interstate 94.

Items 6 & 7: There are thirteen different unions that are expected to perform work on this project, some with multiple collective bargaining agreements. As shown in the attached document, there are many collective bargaining agreements that will expire during completion of the Project. With the high number of different unions expected to be utilized, there is an increased likelihood of jurisdictional disputes among unions or of conflict between unionized and non-unionized workers on the Project.

Item 8: The reconstruction of the existing bridge will be completed under a road closure with vehicular traffic detour around the site on the State's highway system, resulting in potential safety concerns to the traveling public. Labor force continuity and stability will be necessary to the Project, given this circumstance.

Item 9: The use of a PLA on this Project will result in improved access to skilled labor, improved efficiency, and improved safety performance due because it will coordinate the labor forces of thirteen separate trade unions on the Project.
