USE OF RAP (BMPP)

Effective: January 1, 2000
Revised: July 1, 2006

Revised Article 1004.07 to read:

"1004.07 RAP Materials. RAP is reclaimed asphalt pavement resulting from cold milling or crushing of an existing dense graded hot-mix asphalt pavement. RAP must originate from routes or airfields under federal, state or local agency jurisdiction. The Contractor shall supply documentation that the RAP meets these requirements.

(a) Stockpiles. The Contractor shall construct individual, sealed RAP stockpiles meeting one of the following definitions. No additional RAP will be allowed on top of the pile after the pile has been sealed. All stockpiles shall be free from contaminants listed in Article 1004.07(b)

(1) Homogeneous. Homogeneous RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I/ Superpave, or equivalent mixtures only and represent the same aggregates quality, but shall be at least C quality or better, the same type of crushed aggregate (either crushed natural aggregate, ACBF slag or steel slag), similar gradation and similar AC content. If approved by the Engineer, combined single pass surface/binder millings may be considered "homogeneous", with a quality rating dictated by the lowest coarse aggregate quality present in the mixture. Homogeneous stockpiles shall meet the requirements of Article 1007.04(c)(1). Homogeneous RAP stockpiles not meeting these requirements may be processed (crushing or screening) and retested.

(2) Conglomerate 5/8. Conglomerate 5/8 RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I/Superpave, or equivalent mixtures only. The coarse aggregate in this RAP shall be crushed aggregate only and may represent more than one


Dear Mr. Young:

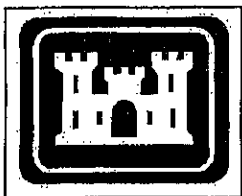

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Replacement of a bridge over the North Branch of the Kishwaukee River as described in your notification and as shown on the plans entitled PLANS FOR PROPOSED BRIDGE REPLACEMENT AND REHABILITATION PROGRAM dated received by this office on July 11, 2006, as prepared by Strand Associates, Inc.

PROJECT LOCATION: Streit Road and the North Branch of the Kishwaukee River, in McHenry County, Illinois (SW ¼ of Section 10 and NW ¼ of Section 15, T45N R17E)

GENERAL CONDITIONS: The above described work is authorized under the terms, conditions and requirements of Regional Permit 3 and shall follow the General Conditions outlined in the Regional Permit Program dated January 1, 2005.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS: To ensure that the activity has minimal individual and cumulative impacts, the following special conditions are required:

1. This authorization is based on the materials submitted as part of application number LRC-2004-13042. Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of this authorization may result in suspension and revocation of your authorization.

2. The time limit for completing the authorized work ends three years from date of issuance. If you find that you need more time to complete the authorized activity, submit your request for a time extension to this office at least two months before the above date is reached.

3. You shall comply with the water quality certification issued under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency for the project.

4. You shall undertake and complete the project as described in the plans entitled PLANS FOR PROPOSED BRIDGE REPLACEMENT AND REHABILITATION PROGRAM dated received by this office on July 11, 2006, as prepared by Strand Associates, Inc. and including all relevant documentation to the project plans as proposed.

5. Throughout the duration of construction activities, you shall adhere to all soil erosion and sediment control measures determined to meet technical standards by the McHenry County SWCD.

6. You are responsible for all work authorized herein and for ensuring that all contractors are aware of the terms and conditions of this authorization. A copy of this authorization must be present at the project site during all phases of construction.

7. You shall notify this office of any proposed modifications to the project, including revisions to any of the plans or documents cited in this authorization. You must receive approval from this office before work affected by the proposed modification is performed.

8. You shall ensure that any wetland areas created or preserved as mitigation for work authorized by this permit shall not be made subject to any future construction and/or fill activities, except for the purposes of enhancing or restoring the mitigation area associated with this permit. All plans are to be approved by this office prior to commencement of any work.

9. You shall notify this office prior to the transfer of this authorization and liabilities associated with compliance with its terms and conditions. The transferee must sign the authorization in the space provided and forward a copy of the authorization to this office.

OTHER INFORMATION:

1. This office has authority to determine if an activity complies with the terms and conditions of the Regional Permit Program (RPP).

2. Limits of RPP authorization:

a. This authorization does not obviate the need to obtain other federal, state, or local authorizations required by law.

b. This authorization does not grant any property rights or exclusive privileges.

c. This authorization does not authorize any injury to the property or rights of others.

d. This authorization does not permit interference with any existing or proposed Federal project.

3. Limits of Federal Liability. The Federal Government does not assume any liability for the following:


a. You fail to comply with the terms and conditions of this authorization.


