The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Chicago District, has completed its review of your notification for authorization under the Regional Permit Program (RPP).

This office has verified that your proposed activity complies with the terms and conditions of Regional Permit RP 3 and the overall RPP under Category I of the Regional Permit Program dated January 1, 2005. The activity may be performed without further authorization from this office provided the activity is conducted in compliance with the terms and conditions of the RPP.

In addition, this authorization is contingent upon the Kane/DuPage Soil and Water Conservation District determining your soil erosion and sediment control plan meets technical standards, and implementing and maintaining soil erosion and sediment controls in a serviceable condition throughout the duration of the project.


This verification expires three (3) years from the date of this letter and covers only your activity as described in your notification and as shown on the plans entitled Southern DuPage County Regional Trail 101st Street Connector-Waterfall Glen Spur dated June 9, 2005, prepared by RJN Group, Inc. Caution must be taken to prevent construction materials and activities from impacting waters of the United States beyond the scope of this authorization. If you anticipate changing the design or location of the activity, you should contact this office to determine the

need for further authorization. This permit does not authorize temporary construction activities, such as the use of earth moving machinery or temporarily stockpiling material within waters of the U.S.

This verification does not obviate the need to obtain all other required Federal, state, or local approvals before starting work. Please note that Section 401 Water Quality Certification has been issued by IEPA for this RP. Enclosed are the IEPA Section 401 Water Quality Certification conditions.
