Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement for Contract No 60W29 in Cook County.

The use of a Project Labor Agreement on this project is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: Estimated project contract cost is \$ 17,805,000

Any disruption in the continuity of this project due to labor issues would result in delayed deadlines that would cause safety concerns for the traveling public. Lapsing trade contracts that would occur during the project would be addressed through the use of a Project Labor Agreement. It is the Illinois Department of Transportation's finding that the large skilled workforce needed for this project can be provided by the union trades involved and is necessary requirement for a Project Labor Agreement.

Item 4: This project is scheduled to begin in early spring 2014 and carry through the winter into the next construction season and will be built under total closure of the bridge. The bridge will be reconstructed while being closed to pedestrian traffic. A pedestrian traffic including access to the CTA will be required to use an alternate route and another adjacent CTA station during construction. The scope of the work includes bridge reconstruction, the demolition of the existing CTA brick house located on Peoria St. Bridge and the repurposing of the existing glass atrium building to function as the new stationhouse, roadway lighting, bridge deck and railings.

Item 5: This project is scheduled to be constructed while being closed to pedestrian traffic and access to CTA station with an estimated time of 310 days under total closure with a Prospective completion date of May 31, 2015, see the Special Provisions for the final completion date.

Item 6. The targeted completion date of this contract falls beyond the union contract expiration dates as shown below

Item 8. - Peoria Street Bridge has no vehicles and is a pedestrian bridge with a CTA station. Pedestrians will need to use an alternate route during construction and access to the other CTA station. While alternate pedestrian route and access to other CTA stations is being posted it will be on routes and stations that are already congested. Any disruption to the contractor's schedule due to labor issues may result in additional hardship on the public if the amount of time they have to deal with pedestrian bridge and CTA station closure.

Item 12. - The project is planned to be completed under a very tight schedule (310 days) which does not allow for any delays by the work force involved in the project and the tight schedule has been established because subsequent roadway contracts cannot begin until this work is complete. The trades expected to be used on this project include but are not limited to laborers, carpenters, masons, operators, electricians and ironworkers. Any work stoppage due to expiration of contracts or strikes will jeopardize the completion of the construction resulting in inconvenience to the motoring public, safety concerns and increased delays.
