 $\underline{[X]}$ 3) The overall size, scope, sequencing, logistics or other aspects of the Project make it particularly challenging to manage, and use of a PLA is expected to help assure that the construction work is performed properly and efficiently under the circumstances. See attachment A below.

 $\underline{[X]}$ 4) The duration of construction activity on the Project is expected to exceed one construction season (i.e., 110 or more working days), or the nature of the Project results in a heightened need for labor force continuity and stability over a substantial period of time.

 $\underline{[X]}$ 5) There is a firm construction completion date established for the Project thereby increasing the adverse consequences of any work stoppage or other labor disruption.

The use of Project Labor Agreement (PLA) for Contract 62N91 is consistent with all State and Local statutory and regulatory requirements.

Item 3: This project includes both State and Federal funding and the programmed cost for this project is estimated at \$54,200,000. The scope of work consists of bridge superstructure replacement of IL 53 over Algonquin Road, full structure replacement of IL 53 over Salt Creek, superstructure replacement of IL 53 over Rand Road, and additional substructure and culvert repairs.
