Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement on FAP 310 (US 067), Contract Number 76568, Jersey County which involves Grading, Drainage and Raving on New Alignment

ITEM 3: Estimated project cost is \$ 24,000,000.00. The project is approximately 2.47 miles.

This Project includes the construction of a four-lane divided rural expressway with areas of full and partial access control. The work includes using portions of the existing US 67 pavement, realignment of one crossroad, construction of a connector road, the extension of one crossroad culvert, and several new crossroad culverts. Sections of the existing US 67 will be milled and resurfaced, removed and replaced, or broken and left in place with proposed embankment and pavement constructed over it. Other items of work include drainage structure, ditch and grass median construction, pavement markings, and all incidental and collateral work necessary to complete the improvement in staged construction as shown on the plans
