Justification for use of a Project Labor Agreement on FAP 2 (IL 3) Contract Number 76N43, Madison County which involves intersection reconstruction of IL 3 at 20<sup>th</sup> Street. In addition, ADA improvements will be constructed within the project limits.

ITEM 3: Estimated project cost is \$6,000,000.

Calendar Days Plus Working Days: +/-30CDs Full Closure Plus +/-10 WDs

The proposed project consists of the reconstructing the intersection of IL 3 at 20<sup>th</sup> Street along with ADA improvements in Granite City. This project consists of removing and replacing all pavement, concrete curb & gutter and all incidental and collateral work necessary to complete the project as shown on the plans and as described herein. The contractor will be allowed to close the entire intersection to perform work activities and traffic will be detoured. As construction is drawn out, this will continue to be an impact to drivers and their daily commute.

ITEM 8: Labor continuity will minimize the amount of time the traveling public is inconvenienced by the periodic lane closures and ongoing construction work.

Any work stoppage during construction will extend the length of the construction project and the amount of time that the full closure of IL Route 3 is in place, thus reducing the overall safety of the roadway to the traveling motorists.
